#### THE SPIRIT SPEAKS

1 Corinthians 2: 1-16

### LAUNCH

Earthly wisdom and Godly wisdom are increasingly at odds. For a bit of fun you might like to see if the group can guess who made the quotes in the Quotes Quiz at the end of these notes. (If you want to go hi-tech there's a PowerPoint also attached.) Which ones might be Godly? Which definitely aren't...?

# **DISCOVERY & UNDERSTANDING**

Paul says in verses 4 and 5: 'My message and my preaching were not with wise and persuasive words, but with a demonstration of the Spirit's power, so that your faith might not rest on men's wisdom, but on God's power.' Do we sometimes let our faith rest on 'men's wisdom' rather than the Spirit's power? Think about how we may tell one from the other.

The Spirit is far more effective in proclaiming the Gospel of Christ than we are; but does that mean we shouldn't use our intellect at all when we proclaim the Gospel or speak into people's lives? Indeed if the Spirit can do a far better job than we can, do we even need to study Scripture?

How does the Spirit speak into situations? How do we get through to the 'non-spiritual' person described in v14?

What is the 'secret wisdom' that the Spirit reveals? Is the 'secret wisdom' just that a good man died and came back to life? What else lies behind that secret? (If you need some prompts, think about Jesus' character and wisdom revealed in some of things he says and does, the love of God, the message of salvation.)

The Spirit bears fruit in our lives. How does the character of Jesus line up with that fruit? (The checklist is in Galatians 5:22-23: 'But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance [other translations say 'patience'], kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law'.)

The scripture here says 'the *fruit* of the Spirit *is* love, joy, peace... etc', often misquoted as the *fruits* of the Spirit *are*...' The singular version is clearly what is meant; why do you think this is? Think about how the meaning might be changed by thinking of 'fruits' rather than 'fruit'.

#### APPLICATION

Ask God to enable the group to speak his word with the power of the Spirit. Pray too for wisdom: James 1 v5: If any of you lacks wisdom, you should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to you. Quotes quiz: Who said the following?
