ello and welcome to Jubilee Church. By chapter 8 of Nehemiah, the building works in Jerusalem have been completed and the great city gates set in place. There has even been an opportunity for Nehemiah to draw up a census of all those who have been returned from exile in Babylon. This is important as it marks the end of the 70 years period that the people of Judah would be in captivity in a far off land.

But now physical and to some extent economic security have been achieved, what next? In chapter 8 the writer of the Nehemiah account (possibly Nehemiah himself, possibly not) turns his attention to the spiritual security of the people. The Law is read and the 'Feast of Booths' celebrated.

Both observances seem antiquated but in fact have tremendous relevance to Christians living in the modern world. Dave Webb-Peploe attempts to explain how as he tackles chapter 8.
