Personally, it seems to me that for the non-Christian this makes perfectly good sense. Random organisms in a random universe don't really need to be responsible for that much because after all, what's the point? But in Philippians 2:12-18 Paul argues that once major value has been added to us through the process of salvation, the responsibility stakes go through the roof in all sorts of areas of our lives.

We look at a few of these this morning as we continue our 'transformation' series in the book of Philippians. Prepare to be challenged by biblical thinking that is not necessarily main stream in Christian circles today.

COMPASSION'S DIFFERENT PATH APPEAL

"My heart is to see women empowered!"



Naomi Scott is a multi-talented actor, singer and songwriter, who can currently be seen starring as Princess Jasmine in Disney's live-action remake of 'Aladdin,' She is also a committed Christian and a Compassion UK Ambassador.



Earlier this year Naomi travelled to Rwanda to see Compassion's Child Survival projects in action. Naomi has been a long-term supporter of Compassion and while in Rwanda, saw first-hand how Compassion Child Survival projects provide vulnerable mums and babies with nutritional, medical and community support, through the local church. They meet their practical and medical needs whilst bringing together a community of women who can support each other emotionally and create an environment where they feel loved and valued.

"On my trip to Rwanda, I met women who are thriving in the midst of hugely challenging personal circumstances. They taught me so much about the significance of women encouraging and supporting one another. It was humbling to meet women embodying resilience and courage. Their voices and stories need to be heard."



Compassion's Child Survival projects reach at-risk children even before they've been born, supporting women during their pregnancy and help vulnerable babies get a healthy start in life.

In Togo there is desperate need - according to the UN, 1 in 20 babies in Togo will die before their first birthday.

Compassion UK will be using funds raised through its Different Path appeal to help mothers in Togo access life-saving support. This includes; transport to vital health care, medical advice, hygiene supplies, nutritional supplements and education that will help secure a healthy future for them and their families.
