ello and welcome to Jubilee Church. This Sunday we have an exciting new mini preaching series for you called

Big Issues'. These will be key areas of the Christian faith where to put it politely, there is much room for debate.

Simon Bagg launches the series with a look at the subject of Evolution versus Intelligent Design. The whole topic of creation and evolution is hotly contested not just between Christians and atheists but also amongst believers themselves. Simon has the possibly unenviable task of outlining the different viewpoints on the subject and maybe providing some helpful hints.

As the series will no doubt reveal, the Christian faith consists of beliefs that are either 'negotiable' or 'non-negotiable'. One non-negotiable for example (quite clearly stated in the bible) is that in order to be a Christian you need to believe in the resurrection of Jesus (hotly debated in our home group a few weeks ago). It's a non-negotiable belief because our salvation as Christians is totally dependent on Christ's resurrection from the dead. Without it we are lost and much to be pitied.

'Negotiables' however allow for differences of opinion without compromising core beliefs, and include such things as 'Why does God allow suffering?', 'Free will or predestination?', 'To speak up or remain quiet?', 'Is it possible to avoid sin as a Christian?' 'End times theology', etc. It will be good to look at some of these big issues over the summer.

Each week throughout the school summer holidays, we are supporting several families who have been referred to us. And we have just had an additional request to support another large family until September, so we need to keep up our donations!

We continue to provide enough food for each family to make a two course meal with a mixture of long life and fresh foods. Additionally we provide milk, fruit juice/squash, biscuits and crisps or chocolate treats each week. We have recently been blessed by the donation of tubes of toothpaste by a local dental practice and food items from a member of the local community. What we need before the Bank Holiday weekend:

- tins of chicken in white sauce meatballs in tomato sauce corned beef
- jars of cooking sauce: tomato/ pasta bake large tins of sweet corn tuna
- dry pasta (not spaghetti) mayonnaise small tomato ketchup
- tinned fruit tins/ packets of custard
- biscuits and chocolate treats (containing NO nuts or soya)
