Bags of Food has had another busy but exciting week. On Monday we provided food for **16 families comprising 67 individuals**. The increased need reflected some of those families who needed help during half-term when their children did not get free school meals.

Donations have been coming in at an amazing rate this week as the national news has focussed on families who are short of food at this time. On Monday alone, we had food and financial gifts from **Church members, neighbours,** the **Rotary Clubs** and other members of **the community.** Throughout the week, this has continued.

We continue to be supported by local businesses such as BP Express, Daines and Gray butchers and Jack's Fish and Chips in Laleham Road have donated vouchers for children (and their families) to get a free Kids meal.

We continue to praise the Lord for meeting our needs week by week. Please continue to pray for those we support, their wellbeing, and the health of the volunteers.

- Tinned meat meals
- Cakes (long shelf-life)
- Angel delight

- Tampons, sanitary towels
- Laundry detergent (liquid or pods)
- Bleach

The Jubilee Centre remains open **(9.00am-4.00pm)** but in the event that no one is there we have a box in the porch where donations can be placed.
