ello and welcome to Jubilee Church.

This morning as we continue our **Limitless Living** series, we move on to the subject of **faith**. Faith can be applied to all sorts of situations. There's saving faith, when we believe and trust that Jesus died for us on the cross. There's also faith for specific problems, such as provision for need or healing of sickness. But the faith that I want us to look at this morning is the faith that enables us to partner with God in carrying out his purposes for planet earth. (Not a small subject area at all!)

The biblical passage that I want to draw on for this vocational or purposeful type of faith is the classic account of David versus Goliath in **1 Samuel 17**. It's a classic boy's own story that we may remember fondly from our Sunday school days. Big versus small. Evil versus good. God overcoming against all the odds. But there are some



interesting elements to the story that we can easily overlook. As we consider these, they provide a more 3-dimensional outlook to the whole question of faith which really emphasises a partnership model as opposed what might best be described as a bystander model (where we simply stand by and watch God do all the work).

Intrigued? I hope so. But I leave you with that memorable verse in the Old Testament book of Esther: 'who knows whether you (and I) were born for a time such as this?' Who knows indeed?








BOOK REVIEW: DAVID & GOLIATH

As I was preparing for this Sunday's sermon, one book that I have particularly enjoyed reading is: David and Goliath: Underdogs, Misfits and the Art of Battling Giants by Malcolm Gladwell. Drawing on this classic Old Testament encounter as his prime example, Gladwell goes on to talk about how in a range of different settings the underdog has ended up winning. Other examples he uses include junior basketball, academic success and the Vietnam War. It's a great analysis about what seems to be a disadvantage on first viewing can actually be an advantage and vice versa. Published by Penguin, it's more a book on popular psychology than Christianity. But the fascinating backdrop is that Gladwell was



raised a Christian (attending Above Bar Church in Southampton with his parents) before letting his faith lapse in his young adult life. However, in the writing of David and Goliath, he returned to his Christian faith as a result of his research into the main story. The spiritual lesson that I took away from reading the book (not specifically stated by him) is that the UK church may appear to be down and out in its battle against secularism and all the other isms of modern society but is it really? Well worth a read on a grey January lockdown sort of a day. Passes the time, informs and helps lift one's spirit.
