"Our worst days are never so bad that you are beyond the reach of God's **grace**. And your best days are never so good that you are beyond the need of God's **grace**."

Why is it so good, I hear you ask? (in my head - lockdown fever I guess). Firstly, it reminds me that I need God's grace every single day of my life. Grace is not a one-off fix that takes place when I'm saved and then after that it's back to good old-fashioned virtue. No, like a patient on life support, I am dependent on grace for every second of my life. I think a lot of Christians forget that.

Secondly, it reminds me that on my worst days when I really mess up and say inconsiderate things to my family/others or simply have a dreadful day all round, God is lovingly and wonderfully there to cover the bases.
