This Sunday we begin a new preaching series where we will be looking at the book of **James**. Martin Luther was not very approving of James and referred to it as 'the straw epistle'. The reason for this was because he felt it undermined the message of grace. Having read James a few times now, I think I might dare to disagree with him. If anything, I think James actually reinforces and explains grace in a really helpful way, but more of that as we go through the series.

The series itself is entitled 'When the Going Gets Tough'. Given all that we have been going through as a church over the last 12 months I am slightly concerned that this title is a bit too close to the bone. However, the word of God is there to help us in every season and circumstance.

Speaking of being close to the bone the writer to the Hebrews writes about God's word:

For the word of God is alive and active. Sharper than any double-edged sword, it penetrates even to dividing soul and spirit, joints and marrow; it judges the thoughts and attitudes of the heart. (Hebrews 4v12)

We do need to be aware that the word of God is not there primarily to educate and inform. It is there to bring about profound change in who we are and what we do. My hope is that as we study the book of James, profound changes will take place in my life, your life and the life of the church as a whole.
