ello and welcome to Jubilee Church.

A few years ago, there was a BBC TV series entitled 'In the footsteps of Alexander the Great'. It was especially appealing to me because it encompassed two of my favourite subjects, history and geography. The geography element of the series (a bit of a travel show in reality) took us from Macedonia in Greece through Persia (modern day Turkey and a big

chunk of the middle east) and then into India. The history element looked at the life of the great man himself - the battles that he fought and the legacy that he left. So, for example, in Muslim countries even today, parents say to their naughty children 'if you don't behave Alexander will come in the middle of the night and punish you'.



Alexander built a huge empire (which was why he was called Great) but it strikes me that he did it all for himself and in the end like all empires his one also turned to dust. This Sunday Malcolm Kayes brings us a sermon entitled **Phillip the Great** (referring to Phillip in the New Testament and like Alexander bearing a Greek name). But unlike Alexander, Phillip wasn't building an empire for himself. Instead, he was involved in a far greater and longer lasting kingdom building project for someone who truly was God (unlike Alexander who rather stupidly claimed to be). Malcolm will remind us of one particular kingdom building exercise that Phillip was involved in and some of the key elements of this that we would do well to emulate.

In the meantime, it would be good to remind ourselves that personal empire projects that we may be involved in will all eventually be washed away like sandcastles on the seashore when the tide comes in. So, let's be careful where, how and for whom we are building!
