DEBTSCAPE SHEPPERTON

Sadly, the time has come to close Debtscape Shepperton. By 31st October 2021 all cases Ray and Diana have will either have been



finished or signposted elsewhere. This has been a tough decision, however, after John passed away earlier in the year the role of Centre Manager needed to be covered as well as meeting and supporting clients. With just 2 advisers it's been difficult for Diana to cover this role as well as support and advise clients and so the time seemed right to close.

Over the last nearly 17 years we have seen many people become debt free and turn their lives around, some have also become personal friends. In the past week we have seen two clients become debt free, another is nearly there, and we're working hard to sort out the last few clients before the end of October.

We would value your prayers:

- That we would see those that are engaging with us become debt free.
- For contact with those we haven't heard from since sending out the closure letter, so that we can signpost them elsewhere.
- For those that have been, and continue to be, affected by Covid, that they will return to health.
- For Diana and Ray as they say goodbye to an incredibly challenging but worthwhile service. We may not know the impact their support and care has had but pray that seeds have been planted and watered.
